Also present was Johor Baru MP Datuk Shahrir Samad who presented a mock-cheque to the Foundation's Chief Executive Officer Jeffrey Perera.

The Rotary Club of Johor Centennial President Wong Ban Seng said the main objectives of this charity run was to create public awareness of the various charitable causes and also to provide an instant community service to the selected beneficiaries.

"This is part of our ongoing community development efforts in terms of bringing families together for a fun day out and to promote healthy living for a more productive and harmonious community", he added.

Shahrir, who launched the event, said the

More than 11,200 families in 120 communities all over Malaysia, including Sabah and Sarawak, now benefit from the MyKasih programme.
