Dear Friends,

n this last quarter of 2017, we added two Orang Asli primary schools in Pahang and Kelantan under the Love My School programme, where we support their entire student population with cashless bursaries, Back-To-School items, 21st Century Classroom Transformation enhancements, and tuition classes. This, we hope, will motivate the students to excel academically and contribute positively to their families and the nation when they eventually graduate.

In further promoting our focus on Orang Asli and education, a musical fund-raiser themed 'December Love' was staged by PAN Productions at the Gardens Theatre in Kuala Lumpur in aid of the MyKasih Orang Asli Children's Education Fund. RM 153,870 was raised through donations, ticket sales and a charity auction. Similarly, proceeds of another charity auction, organised by the Ferrari Owners Club of Malaysia's during their gala dinner in Kuala Lumpur, were also channelled towards the same Orang Asli Children's Education Fund.

With the support of donors and partners in education, we hope to reach out to more primary and secondary schools to assist students from economically-challenged backgrounds. I would therefore like to extend my sincere appreciation to Shell Malaysia and Caltex for their fund-raising campaigns this year which are benefitting high-need schools.

I would also like to recognise donors such as DIALOG and Linaco Group, for mobilising their staff volunteers to engage with their adopted student beneficiaries during the annual school sports day events. These events demonstrate our care and attention for the communities we are reaching out to and serve to inspire the children to dream big and achieve higher aspirations.

Our signature 'Love My Neighbourhood' cashless food aid programme carries on in communities chosen by our donors. Meanwhile, MyKasih's collaboration with the Malaysian Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government (KPKT) has been extended for another two years (2018-2019) to aid 1,800 families through the Titipan Kasih food basket programme. We are pleased to be able to continue our support of the Ministry's programme through the use of our cashless payment system in more than 80 locations nationwide since 2014.

December has indeed been a productive month for us in renewing sponsorships for the 'Love My Neighbourhood' and the 'Love My School' programmes. On that note, my wife and I would like to thank all Donors, Retail Partners, Programme Partners, and Volunteers from the bottom of our hearts, for believing in the work that we do in MyKasih Foundation.

We are deeply grateful for the support rendered in enabling us to effectively deliver meaningful programmes in communities we reach out to. We hope our partnership will continue into 2018 and beyond.


Overview of Windowski Alasin

Established in April 2009, MyKasih Foundation is a charity organisation founded by DIALOG's Executive Chairman Tan Sri Dr Ngau Boon Keat and his wife Puan Sri Jean Ngau, to help low-income families through food aid and education regardless of race, religion or descent.

The uniqueness of the MyKasih programme compared to other non-profit organisations doing food aid is in the former's technological edge in driving welfare distribution. The MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme and the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary scheme run on


an efficient cashless payment system developed by DIALOG Innovation Ventures Services Sdn Bhd, formerly known as ePetrol Services Sdn Bhd, a subsidiary of DIALOG Group Berhad. The system uses the chip technology of the Malaysian identity card, the MyKad, to disburse welfare aid to target beneficiaries.

Similarly, student beneficiaries under the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary programme use their MyKasih student smartcard to buy food and drinks at the school canteen, as well as books and stationery at the school bookshop. MyKasih believes that if the families' basic needs can be met, the children can complete proper education and hence have the opportunity of stepping out of poverty through better job employment.


MyKasih Today

MyKasih started with a pilot project involving 25 families back in December 2008. To-date, we have channeled **RM 210 million** via the MyKasih cashless payment system to almost **240,000 families** in over 400 locations nationwide, out of which, 14,000 are primary and secondary student beneficiaries aided through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary scheme.



The scope of the MyKasih system has expanded beyond food aid and student bursaries to include cashless payments for public transportation, fuel, medical treatments and utility bills. Essentially, the MyKad account becomes the single main account to which low-income households can use to access multiple welfare products or services.

The Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government, Johor and Sarawak State Governments, as well as Lembaga Zakat Selangor and Majlis Agama Islam Melaka, have been using the innovative MyKasih system for their respective welfare programmes for the underprivileged.

MyKasih Charity Golf 2017

Putting for a good cause



he skies held up for 136 golfers to complete 18 holes on the Valley Course of Glenmarie Golf & Country Club on 30 September 2017. The seventh annual MyKasih Charity Golf tournament successfully raised RM 1,167,010 through flight sponsorships and cash donations. DIALOG was the main sponsor of the tournament, having taken up 10 flights worth RM 200,000.

During the lunch prize presentation ceremony, MyKasih Foundation Chairman and Co-Founder, Tan Sri Dr Ngau Boon Keat, thanked all the golfers and the sponsor organisations for their support.

The tournament's mode of play was System 36 Stableford over 18 holes, with three player categories - Medal A, Medal B and Ladies. The main prize winners were Saufian for Medal A, Peter Majid for Medal B, and Joyce Ong for Ladies.

The Bulls-Eye collection of RM 9,600 was donated in full to MyKasih Foundation since none of the golfers were able to claim it. As is almost tradition, Paul Gould and his family made their annual contribution of RM 30,000 to MyKasih

Love My Neighbourhood

Food Aid Programme

Food aid is the first step taken to engage with our targeted communities. Based on the needs and readiness of the community, the food aid is often followed by the Love My School bursary programme and other empowerment programmes.

MyKasih Foundation does not give out assistance to the low-income households on an ad-hoc basis. Instead, we make a long-term commitment to empower the people we help.

Food aid recipients receive a bimonthly allowance, which they draw upon using their MyKad or MyKasih smartcard at participating retail outlets. They are able to choose different brands of essential food items from an approved list of ten product categories.

To guard against abuse, a unique barcode-scanning process at the point-of-sale ensures that only approved items are purchased. Recipients key in their 6-digit PIN when paying with their MyKad or MyKasih smartcard.

Transparency and accountability are traits our donors value when deciding to sponsor our projects.

10 DIFFERENT PRODUCT CATEGORIES

MyKasih food aid recipients are from low-income households earning a combined monthly household income of RM 1,500 and below. Under the programme, recipients receive a cashless monthly allowance of RM 80 through their MyKad account, which can be spent on approved essential food items at partner retail outlets from 10 different product categories.

n 24 November 2017, The Store Group presented a RM 106,000 cheque to MyKasih Foundation to support 110 families in Perak through the MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme.

total of 1818 runners participated in the Bursa Bull Charge 2017 on 14 September 2017 in Kuala Lumpur. The run raised funds that benefitted 34 charitable organisations. MyKasih Foundation was one of the chosen beneficiaries to receive RM 89,000, which will provide food aid, financial literacy training and a health screening programme for the Temiar Orang Asli community in Pos Piah, Perak.

Located in Sungai Siput, the Orang Asli of Pos Piah rarely venture far from their village due to its remoteness from the more economically vibrant city of Ipoh.

'Let's Rock' charity concert in aid of MyKasih Foundation raises funds for flood-affected communities.

TI Malaysia brought two of its Community Investment Partners together - the Kuala Lumpur Performing Arts Centre (KLPac) and MyKasih Foundation on 30 November 2017 and hosted 'Let's Rock', a concert staging the best of rock music from the 50s right up to current times.

The concert was headlined by an eclectic mix of vocalists including Fuad of Kyoto Protocol, songstress Bihzhu and singersongwriter Nick Davis. The three talented performers joined forces with the KLPac Symphonic Band under the baton of Conductor Kevin Christensen, the 4-piece band led by Loh Ui Li and the 20-member Young Choral Academy Chorus.

Almost 60 musicians and singers from different fields came together for a concert of epic proportions. The concert

paid tribute to the greats - from the King of Rock and Roll himself, Elvis Presley, to pioneering bands like Guns N' Roses, The Cranberries, as well as some of the hottest bands dominating the airwayes today including Coldplay and Snow Patrol.

The rock concert raised RM 7,000 through cash donations and ticket sales which went to rural flood-affected Orang Asli communities in Gerik, Perak, through the MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' cashless food aid programme.

This is in addition to their fifth annual contribution this year of RM 500,000 to support 520 economically-challenged families through the 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid programme.

Malaysia's Managing Guilherme Silva, said, "We see this as a mutually beneficial opportunity to bring together both our community investment partners - KLPac and MyKasih. On one part, we are able to contribute positively to the advancement of the local performing arts scene and on the other, a meaningful contribution is being made towards the underprivileged communities."

KLPac's unique partnership with JTI Malaysia has enabled them to stage acclaimed productions previously such as 'Symphonic Swing', 'Rashomon', 'A Streetcar Named Desire', 'One Thousand Million Smiles – A Tribute to Sudirman', also in aid of MyKasih Foundation.

We are extremely appreciative of JTI Malaysia's effort to raise funds for MyKasih through the 'Let's Rock' concert. We hope that this partnership will continue to flourish for the benefit of economically-challenged communities across the country.

ver 470 Berjaya Youth ("B.Youth") volunteers crowded Kuala Lumpur's busy Berjaya Times Square on the Saturday morning of 28 October 2017 to end hunger. In the spirit of volunteerism, the Rise Against Hunger Meal Packing charity event saw over RM 100,000 worth of meals being packed to be donated to those in need.

MyKasih Foundation was one of the charities selected by Berjaya to receive RM 20,000 worth of meals to be distributed to Orang Asli communities within the foundation's network.

In 2017, MyKasih Foundation has received over 10,908 meal packs including contributions from HSBC Bank Malaysia (5,040 packs) and Sunway Group (2,520 packs) through the Rise Against Hunger initiative.

The meal packs were distributed to the Orang Asli communities in Kampung Bertang and Kampung Ruai in Pahang, and also flood affected families in Kelantan in December 2017.

We are truly grateful to the kind donors and volunteers who are fighting hunger together with us. Let's not have children of today go hungry. Let's end hunger.

Love My School

Student Bursary Programme

The MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary programme is an extension of MyKasih's welfare programme for low-income households.

Students from economically-challenged backgrounds are rendered assistance in the form of annual bursaries, which the students draw upon using a smartcard linked to their MyKad account to purchase school books and stationery from the bookstore, as well as meals at the school canteen.

DIFFERENT PRODUCT CATEGORIES

The bursary programme provides students with allowances via their MyKad-linked student smartcard to pay for their daily meals at the school canteen, as well as books and other learning necessities from the school bookstore.

The aid can be extended to include Back-to-School items such as uniforms, shoes, bags and stationery, to prepare the students for the new academic year.

Students may purchase approved essential items from four product categories.



nce sea nomads, the Mah Meri Orang Asli community in Carey Island, Selangor, now eke a living as odd-job labourers, farmers, fishermen, plantation workers or factory workers. Many struggle to make ends meet and to keep their children in school.

When Linaco Group learnt of the plight of the Mah Meri, they adopted a primary school there in June 2017. They support 50 students of Sekolah Kebangsaan Sungai Bumbun (Asli) through the MyKasih 'Love My School' student bursary programme with an annual commitment of RM 36,000.



rimary Year Six students of Sekolah Kebangsaan Tasik Cini, Pekan, Pahang sitting for their Primary School Achievement Test (UPSR) are now able to prepare for their exams in comfort within their newly refurbished school dormitory, fondly named "Villa Gumum".

Traditionally, in the three months leading up to UPSR, SK Tasik Cini students will take part in 'Program Gempur UPSR', an intensive supplementary tuition programme conducted by the school

To encourage attendance for the programme, especially for students who have to travel long distances by boat to reach the school, students would stay in a makeshift dormitory between the teachers' quarters. The dormitory was initially built out of plywood, without proper toilets, and had thin floor mattresses for the students to sleep on.

When DIALOG adopted the school in June 2017 through the 'Love My School' programme, the company spent RM 17,500 to refurbish Villa Gumum. The dormitory was completed just in time for 'Program Gempur UPSR' in July 2017 which was conducted in collaboration with Universiti Malaysia Pahang.

Five students were hosted at the dormitory and they participated in the programme along with 12 others. DIALOG also sponsored the food cost of the 3-month 'Program Gempur UPSR' for the 17 students amounting to RM 5,760.
