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Chairman's Message

Dear Friends,

The Foundation's focus this year has been on our 'Love My School' initiative, supporting 6,700 students in 74 primary and secondary schools with cashless bursaries for them to buy canteen meals, uniforms, and other learning materials at school. We also had the opportunity to support classroom digital upgrades, as well as students' participation in sports and robotics competitions across the country and overseas.

On December 21, we received the best Christmas news from Gold Coast, Australia. Our sponsored student team from the indigenous primary school of SK Pengkalan Tereh won gold against 15 other countries at the 27th International Robot Olympiad for the Junior Creative Idea Category. The other four school teams we sponsored achieved 1 Bronze in the Junior Technical Creative Category and 3 Technical Robot Awards. Our heartiest congratulations to all of them for making Malaysia proud! Successful outcomes such as these motivate us to keep investing in education.



In this newsletter, we highlight our donors, namely DIALOG, FWD Malaysia, Hess Asia, Padini Holdings, EnQuest Petroleum, Malaysia Airports Holdings Berhad, Amanat Lebuh Raya Rakyat Berhad, and OXY – who continue to contribute generously towards the 'Love My School' initiative. We also thank ConocoPhillips Malaysia, Deleum Berhad, Micron Malaysia and Manulife who collectively supported 336 flood affected families in Sabah with RM500 one-off assistance per family.

At the same time, our engagement by the Federal Government on Program Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA), has now grown to include the larger B40 group, effectively reaching 5.4 million recipients nationwide. The recipients are given monthly aid via their MyKad to shop at any of the 10,000 partner retailers under the programme.

In August, the Government launched Penghargaan SARA (SARA For All) which saw 22 million Malaysians receiving RM100 one-off in their MyKad account to spend on household essentials. This initiative kicked off on 31 August and ran in tandem with the monthly SARA programme. Suffice to say, we had an unforgettable Merdeka Day, as we worked round-the-clock to support our merchant partners cope with the surge of shoppers.

We wrapped up the year with two successful fund-raisers - the MyKasih Charity Golf and MyKasih Charity Musical. The RM2.3 million in donation proceeds will go a long way in creating lasting impact in the lives of those who need it most.

The milestones achieved this year reaffirm our belief that collective effort across public, private, and individual partners can shape a more inclusive and compassionate future for all. We are committed to building on this momentum, expanding our reach, and continuing to innovate in how we serve. We hope you are inspired by what we do and will join us to do good together.

MyKasih Today

MyKasih started with a pilot MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' food aid project involving 25 families back in 2009. As of December 2025, we have channelled billions via the MyKasih cashless payment system to more than 22 million families nationwide, which include primary and secondary student beneficiaries aided through the MyKasih 'Love My School' bursary scheme.

The Federal and State Governments, as well as Zakat agencies, also use the innovative MyKasih system for their respective welfare programmes.

The scope of the MyKasih system has expanded beyond food aid and student bursaries to include cashless payments for public transportation, fuel, medical treatments, and utility bills. Essentially, the MyKad account becomes the single main account to which low-income households can use to access multiple welfare products or services.

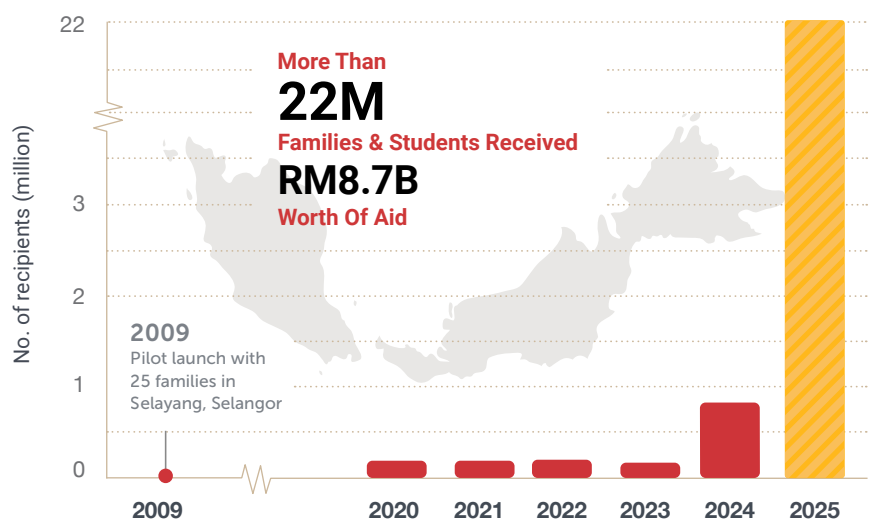

Indigenous Students Win Gold For Malaysia

MyKasih extends our heartiest congratulations to the Orang Asli pupils from Sekolah Kebangsaan Pengkalan Tereh, Kluang, Johor for winning the gold medal at the 27th International Robot Olympiad (IRO 2025) in Gold Coast, Australia.

The annual event, which was held from 17-21 December 2025, saw SK Pengkalan Tereh beating participants from 15 other countries to bring home the gold medal in the Creative Idea

(Primary School) Category.

Malaysia sent 15 Orang Asli pupils from five primary schools to represent the country in the IRO 2025. DIALOG sponsored the trip for all five Asli school teams from SK Pengkalan Tereh, SK Sayong Pinang, SK Pos Raya, SK Permatang Keledang and SK Kampung Layau. Collectively, they achieved 1 Gold, 1 Bronze in the Junior Technical Creative Category, and 3 Technical Robot Awards.

SARA is an extension of the Government's Sumbangan Tunai Rahmah (STR) programme, a targeted assistance programme for people most affected by the rise in cost of living. This contribution aimed to improve the socioeconomic status of vulnerable groups under the 2025 Budget.

With the successful roll-out of the MyKad-driven SARA programme in 2024 in Peninsular Malaysia, MyKasih Foundation was engaged once again by the Government to expand the programme's

coverage to include Sabah, Sarawak and Labuan.

More outlets were engaged and additional items such as household cleaning products were included.

By April 2025, 5.6 million SARA beneficiaries could choose from a range of 100,000 approved products.

Who gets SARA

STR application is needed to qualify for the monthly SARA aid. This can be done via www.bantuan tunai.hasil.gov.my or at the nearest Inland Revenue Board (LHDN) office.

STR 2025 recipients who have been verified in the eKasih database as Extremely Poor and Poor are eligible for SARA 2025 amounting to RM50 - RM200 per month for a period of 12 months (January 2025 - December 2025).

All other STR 2025 recipients in the 'Household' and 'Senior Citizens without a Partner' categories receive RM100/RM50 per month for a period of 9 months (April 2025 - December 2025).

Penghargaan SARA 2025

Penghargaan SARA commenced on 31 August 2025 in conjunction with Hari Merdeka, in parallel with the on-going SARA 2025 initiative.

22 million Malaysians had the opportunity to use their MyKad and spend their RM100 credit. By the end of the year, more than 10,000 outlets and 140,000 products were registered under SARA.

All Malaysians aged 18 and above received a one-off RM100 valid until 31 December 2025. This included those who were already on the monthly programme, thereby effectively supplementing the total support available to the household.

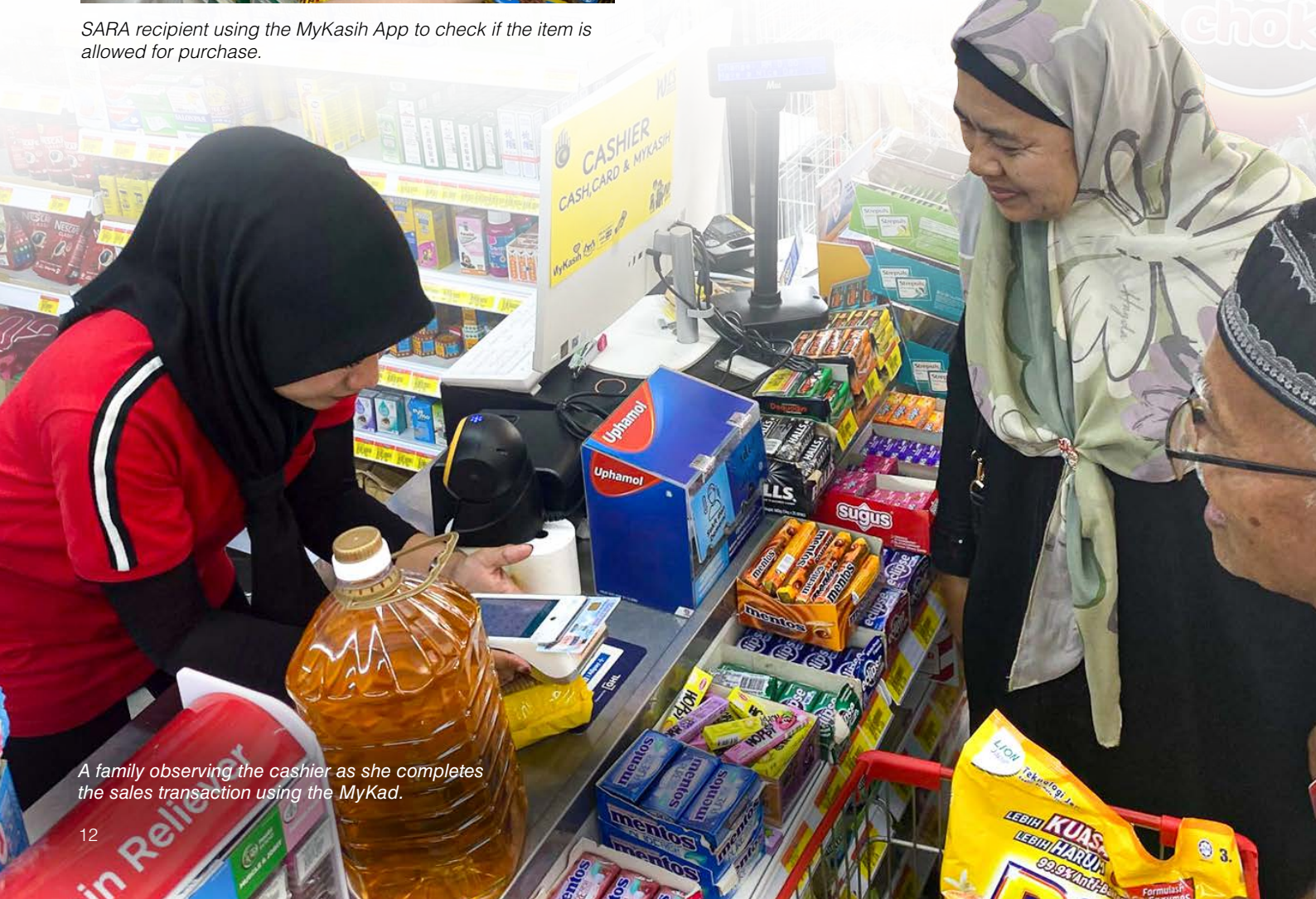

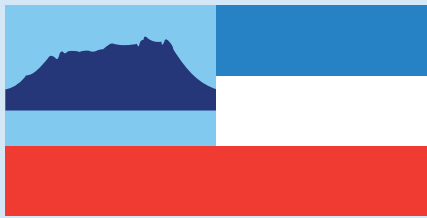

Post-Flood Relief In Sabah

In September 2025, widespread flooding and landslides affected several villages in Penampang, Sabah following days of relentless heavy rain. Hundreds of residents were evacuated and relocated to temporary relief centres after their homes were damaged in the floods.

Several donors responded by providing much-needed assistance to affected families. Pooled funds amounting to RM168,100 enabled a total of 336 families to each receive a one-off RM500 assistance channelled via their MyKad, which was used to purchase basic household appliances and essential food items as they rebuilt their homes and lives in the aftermath of the disaster.

Amanat Lebuhraya Rakyat Extends Support To 250 Students

Not-for-profit concessionaire Amanat Lebuhraya Rakyat Berhad (ALR) expanded its annual school support programme to include Sekolah Kebangsaan Puchong Perdana this year, bringing the total number of students supported to 250 across five schools for the full 2025 academic term.

The schools were selected based on their proximity to the LITRAK, KESAS, SPRINT and SMART highways. They are:

- SJK (Tamil) Castlefield, Puchong (near LITRAK Highway)
- SK Puchong Perdana, Puchong (near LITRAK Highway)
- SK Asli Bukit Kemandol, Jenjarom (near KESAS Highway)
- SMK Seri Pantai, Kerinchi, Kuala Lumpur (near SPRINT Highway)
- SMK (P) Pudu, Kuala Lumpur (near SMART Highway)

Earlier this year, ALR's Sentuhan Ikhlas campaign concluded in March upon achieving its target of five million MyDebit transactions. Launched on 26 September 2024, the campaign transformed everyday toll payments into an avenue for contributing towards the wellbeing of B40 families across Malaysia.

Through the collective participation of MyDebit users at the LDP, KESAS, SPRINT and SMART highways, a total of 1,000 B40 families in Lembah Pantai, Gombak, Sungai Petani, Jitra, Ayer Keroh and Muar each received RM500 in financial assistance credited to recipients' MyKad.

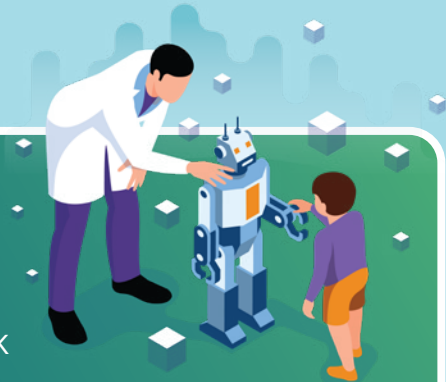

More than 30 students benefitted from robotics and learnt coding, engineering and problem-solving skills. 6 schools could participate in robotics competitions.

Impact

SK Padang Rumbia secured 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the state qualifying round of the 2025 National Robotics Competition (NRC), followed by 5th place in the national finals. The school also represented Malaysia at the MakeX International Robotics Tournament 2025 in Bali, Indonesia, where the team received the Best Cultural Award.





AQUAPONICS

ECN Strengthens Community Support In Northern States



ECN World Marketing Sdn. Bhd., owner-operator of the Pasaraya Econo, Econo Jaya and Econo Express chain, continued its commitment to give back to the community through the MyKasih 'Love My Neighbourhood' cashless food aid programme.

A total of 100 families in Kedah received RM100 per month from January to June, while another 50 families in Perlis and 50 in Penang were supported with the same from August 2025 to January 2026.

For the year 2025, Hess allocated CSR support amounting to RM213,300 for the MyKasih 'Love My School' & Back-To-School programmes in two schools benefitting 250 students, an after-school programme in PPR Lembah Subang covering robotics and tuition classes for a period of six months, three community days in support of women and youth empowerment in Klang Valley, as well as two upskilling programmes for youths from underserved communities in KL.

On 29 November 2025, Block 98 of PPR Flat Sri Kota in Bandar Tun Razak, Kuala Lumpur was abuzz with activities. There were morning zumba aerobic exercises, children's fashion show and colouring contests, family games and telematches, and a futsal competition for the youths.

Organised by local community leaders and Women of Will with funding support from Hess via MyKasih Foundation, the objective of the community day was to foster neighbourhood camaraderie while encouraging healthy lifestyle in a fun and engaging way.

Other stakeholders who contributed to the community health carnival by setting up activity booths included The Communication for Behavioural Impact, Pockets of Pink, Scouts Association of Malaysia, Klinik Kesihatan Ehsan, Komuniti Sihat Perkasa Negara, Welfare Department, Re:kayu, and King's College University.

Eight Years Of Impact With SK Sungai Dua (Asli)

Padini has been a valued donor partner of MyKasih since 2018, supporting students at Sekolah Kebangsaan Sungai Dua (SK Sg Dua), a rural Orang Asli primary school in Bentong, Pahang with an average of 125 students annually.

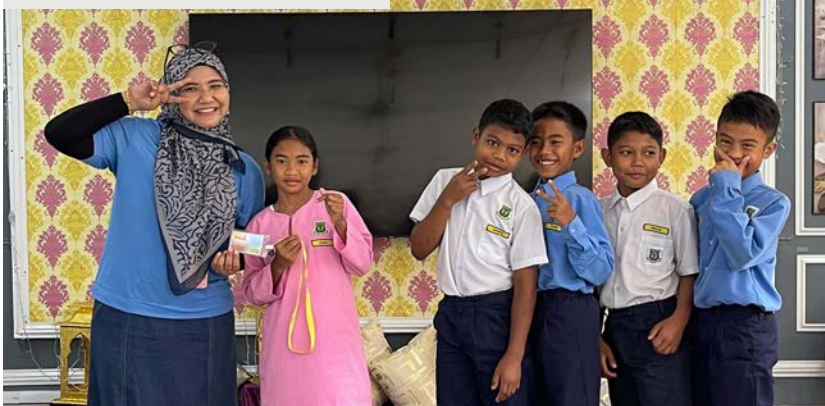
Over the past eight years, Padini has consistently ensured students' access to daily canteen meals and schooling necessities through MyKasih's 'Love My School' programme. Teachers have observed improved attendance, stronger classroom engagement, and increased confidence among students.

Padini also contributed towards the refurbishment of the school's computer lab in 2018 as well as a school trip to KidZania and a movie outing in 2019. These initiatives provided Orang Asli students with access to 21st-century learning tools and experiences that broaden their horizons to help reduce everyday barriers to learning.

Recognising that sustained support is key in ensuring positive student outcomes, Padini pledged RM100,000 for the initiative in 2026.



Each student receives RM80 per month via a smartcard, helping to ease financial pressures on families. In turn, students are better able to focus on learning.



For students from Orang Asli communities, the programmes supported by Padini provide opportunities to participate more confidently in school and on more equal footing with their peers.

EnQuest Supports Learning Development In SK Sungai Pergam

EnQuest's continued support of the MyKasih 'Love My School' programme at Sekolah Kebangsaan Sungai Pergam has made a meaningful difference to Orang Asli students throughout 2025.

Through MyKasih's cashless bursary system, 43 students aged 7 to 14 received support for daily meals, school uniforms, books, and stationery.

Beyond bursary support, EnQuest's contribution enabled students to benefit from a range of personal development, sports, and STEM programmes, such as:

- The school's annual Kem Jati Diri camp in Kuala Terengganu
- Competitions in sports, arts, literature, and robotics
- Refurbishment of the school's science lab and sports inventory



In recognition of good attendance and performance, students were rewarded with an educational trip to Kuala Lumpur.

Following the encouraging outcomes of the 2025 programmes, EnQuest's has renewed their support with another RM60,000 for 2026, ensuring students from underserved communities continue to gain access to the right resources and opportunities to thrive.

OXY Empowers Students Through Literacy

Following two years of providing after-school literacy classes in four Orang Asli schools in Selangor since 2023, OXY Malaysia strengthened its commitment to improving literacy among underserved students by extending the programme to four additional schools in Kuala Langat, Selangor in 2025.

The schools are:

- SK (Asli) Kampung Busut
- SK (Asli) Bukit Tadam
- SK (Asli) Sungai Bumbun
- SK Olak Lempit

The consumer healthcare company's contribution of RM50,000, raised through their fundraising campaign "Sending Love and Care to Children", supported after-school literacy classes led by teachers at the respective primary schools over 3-5 months.

This marks OXY's third consecutive year of partnering with MyKasih, having reached a total of eight schools. Having contributed RM150,490 since 2023, OXY enabled equitable access to education, strengthening foundational literacy skills and supporting the holistic development of students in underserved communities.



To mark the programme's launch, OXY organised a lively math-themed telematch on 11 September 2025, creating an engaging platform for students to apply their math skills through interactive challenges while fostering teamwork and camaraderie.

Over three years, the programme has shown consistent and growing impact:

2023

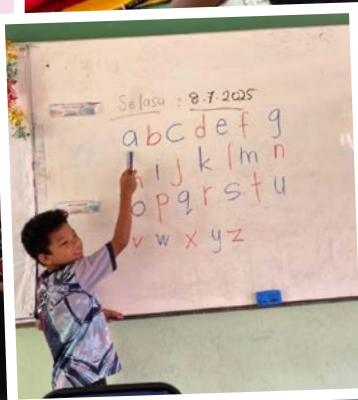
35% of students achieved minimum literacy levels and graduated from the programme.

2024

Graduation rates rose to 40%, accompanied by increases in attendance and boosting of student confidence across schools.

2025

Approximately 60% of students met minimum literacy levels, with proficiency gains of up to 72.5% in Mathematics, 65.8% in English, and 63.3% in Bahasa Melayu.



The funds were used for learning and teaching materials, books and bookshelves for mini classroom libraries, meals to support student nutrition and encourage attendance, and tokens of appreciation for students who demonstrated good attendance and performance.

Yayasan Hartalega Supports Community Tutors In Early Education

Teacher capacity building is a core component of community-based learning aimed at providing quality lessons for rural indigenous children in preparation for school.

Since 2016, nine community learning centres or Pusat Didikan Komuniti (PDK) in the rural Orang Asli communities of Pahang and Perak are supported with daily meals and early education, thanks to various donor partners of the MyKasih Orang Asli Children's Education Fund.

Building on the foundation laid in previous years, Yayasan Hartalega chipped in to provide PDK tutors with capacity building this 2025. On top of a series of on-site training sessions, a centralised strategic meeting was organised for the community members to learn from each other.

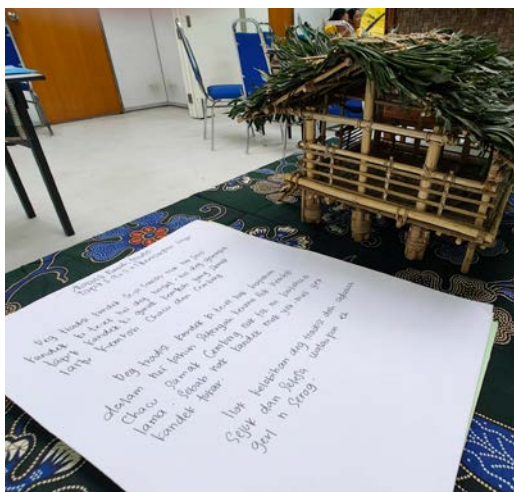
Additional support was also given for minor PDK refurbishments and fun community activities. These are crucial to have parents invested in their children's education while fostering a conducive learning environment.

Pardi Learns Organic Farming Skills



17-year old Pardi hails from a remote Asli village in Gerik, Perak. On a good day, it would typically take 5 hours on rough terrain via a 4x4 vehicle to reach his home.

In January 2026, Pardi will begin his one-year internship in Dignity Farm Academy in Bentong, Pahang, sponsored by MyKasih Foundation. There, Pardi will be exposed to a range of activities such as cultivating fruits and vegetables, learning composting, and animal husbandry.

It is not all manual labour on the farm. Students and interns at Dignity Farm also attend soft skills class, are exposed to computer literacy, and partake in discussions to complete group assignments.



“ Most of the activities here are done in groups. I value this. We can achieve a lot when we work as a team. So far, I am learning to grow vegetables, make compost, and do animal husbandry. On weekends, I do some sports, go fishing at the farm’s pond, or play my guitar. The students here at the farm academy are of different nationalities. I enjoy making friends and learning about other cultures. ”



“ My parents advised me to learn as much as I can to be able to survive in the city and to bring all this knowledge to share with my community. I am very grateful to MyKasih Foundation and Dignity Foundation for the opportunity. After this internship is over, I hope to learn electrical wiring and cooking. ”

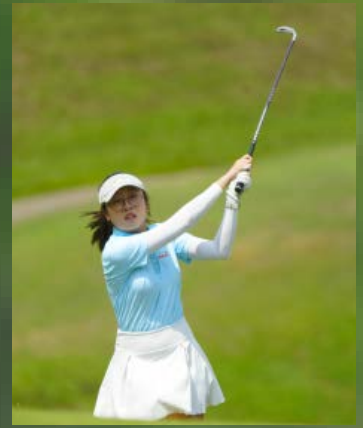

From Flour To Flourishing

Madam Saraswathy a/p Periyasamy, more fondly known as Kak Saras, is a mother of four from PPR Raya Permai, Kuala Lumpur. Not long ago, making ends meet was a daily struggle. Today, her daughter is on her way to a medical degree on scholarship and Kak Saras is able to move around in her own car. Behind both milestones is a baking programme that gave her and her family far more than financial relief.

Since 2024, MyKasih Foundation has partnered with Women of Will and Mondelez International (Malaysia), through their chocolate brand, Cadbury Dairy Milk, to empower women in PPR Raya Permai and PPR Lembah Subang, Selangor with skills, market access and real income opportunities.

Kak Saras was one of 25 women engaged in the programme, Cadbury's 'Kuih Raya Dari Hati' campaign. Throughout the two-year campaign, the community bakers worked in synergy to bake over 600,000 pieces of Cadbury Chocolate Tarts, generating an income of over RM300,000. This feat earned the women a place in the Malaysia Book of Records for the most cookies baked for charity within a month in 2024 (150,000 pieces).

Kak Saras now empowers others with skills and opportunities, going from recipient to role model in her own community.
